Virginia-based artist Melissa Terlizzi started working with polymer clay in 2011, and is best known for whimsical nature-inspired wall pieces, small sculptures, and jewelry. Melissa combines colored polymer clay, simple canes, and heat-set oil paints to recreate the patterns and textures of animals, such as turtles, frogs, birds and insects. Her work is detailed and lifelike, but almost always whimsical.

Melissa's art has also been profiled in several publications: the "Fredericksburg Literary & Art Review" (2017), "Polymer Week Magazine" (2018), Polymer Journeys 2019: The Art & Craft of Polymer (2019), and the popular online blog, "Polymer Clay Daily." Melissa is also one of the featured artists in A New Generation of Polymer Clay, published in 2019.

Melissa teaches workshops and a kids' summer camp near her home, and is a regular instructor at the online art education website, Curious Mondo.com, in Utah. She is also one of the featured 2020 instructors in the popular yearlong online course, "Polymer Clay Adventure."
